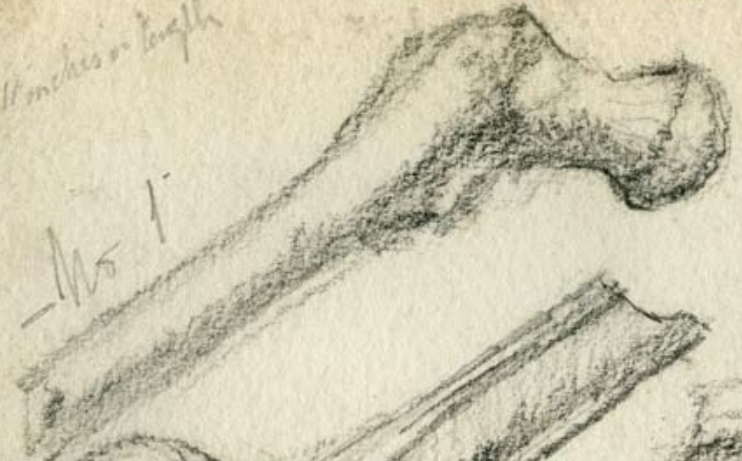
Sir. Nothing to my

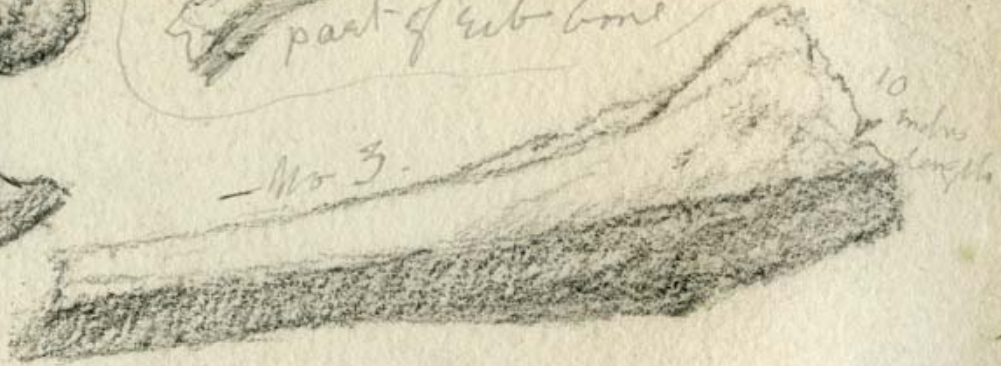

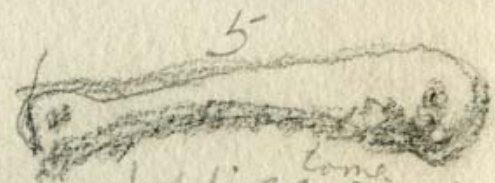
