I beg to thank
you for your letter
of the 24th inst.

My letter to Mr. Peck
which he forwarded to
you has found its

way to you. I enclose from
Mr. James ^{Mitchellson} of Piskering

North York, & the
following is the substance
of a few letters I made
on the 20th inst. re-
specting the locality
he described in his
company.

In the mouth of Sweet
Creek he found in the
Costa Beck, about
2 miles to the south
west of the town of

Purchasing the remains
^{old oak,}
of two rods of piles
from 8 to 10 inches in
diameter about 2 feet
apart, & a space of
about $4\frac{1}{2}$ feet
separated the two rods.
Close to the South
side of the piles & he
took from the land
of the stream & from
its peaty banks 4 or

broken up & washed
into the canal.

& lead into the canal
on the side of the

is anxious to make
explorations & to
