additional monuments to be added to the Schedule I write to inform you that on receiving a list of such monuments from the Council of the Society I will lay it before the Commissioners of Works with a view to obtaining their consideration of the matter. It would greatly facilitate matters if the names of the owners of the monuments could be appended to the list with their address and still more so if the Council

through their members could obtain the consent of the owners to having their monuments placed under the guardianship of the Commissioners of Works.
