However there were also some items which came to the University Museum in 1886 and were transferred to the PRM in 1887 which seem to have been accessioned as part of the Pitt Rivers collection [See Beatrice Blackwood, 'Classification etc' 1970 and 1884.1.1][see also Chapman, 1981: 418]. The following letter seems to suggest that the majority of these are from the Nicobar Islands. It seems that the destination of UM for the items donated in 1886 is a question of semantics. The collection was sent by Man to Tylor who at that time was associated with the UM, the collection may always have been intended for the PRM. See letter from EH Man in PRM Archives:

Examined in October 2005 by Lotika Varadarajan, from New Delhi, who has studied and written about the Nicobar Islands. Varadarajan noted that the indigo dyed material would have come from the Mainland, probably traded for coconuts, as there were no dyes or weaving on the Nicobar Islands. The tassels at the top of the hat, on both sides, are the same style of decoration found on other local objects, for example on the boats. The fibre used to form the frame of the hat is a bark taken from the bottom of the coconut tree, and is also used for making containers etc. This style of hat is no longer used on the Nicobar Islands.
