Goats wrote me about *A. Cervinus*. The breed arrived about the beginning of June, and is still in the Sandy Country but in diminished numbers. *A. malleus* looks like *P. cristatus* and not temporary nests or shelters under stones. Whether it is travelling I can't say, but will try and find out.

*P. cristatus*, *Amantopos* (Sibiricus), *Cheropus* (Tobijak) and probably *Ubyroni* bred in June and July this year. *A. Cervinus* (Volabisk) bred in April or May, but I fancy the breeding times may vary in accordance with the seasons.

I got a note from Crown Point offering any number of Males up to twenty at your price

but am waiting to hear from you before replying - Sales stand that several Males had been found at the Alice Well, and altogether they appear to be exceptionally numerous this year.
