of the class system out West

in time reading between the
lines of his letters I can't

See that we are involved not in
getting the information from
me, in the letter he said
he particularly wanted the
information as it was the
"one thing wanting to round
off his work." Coote was here
a short time ago. He is fairly
bogged in step 8 class. September
& cannot make up his mind or
laissez it. You may be sure
I did not pass it till he
wrote to Stirling sometime ago.
Saying that he believed the
system of the Witch was
similar to that of the
Wauromanga but that I had
reduced the idea. I am still
writing this letter while watching
the instruments so you will see

I am sure you will be pleased to hear that his researches result in much information which goes a long way to help consider valuable. I shall be more than content when after daily getting deeper into the bushways of Aboriginal life the deeper we get the clearer

understood this work seriously,
your investigation. I fully recognise
that without your assistance &
guidance I could not have
accomplished half as what has
been done. I doubt whether ~~I~~
I should have gone ~~so~~ further than
what is contained in the first
volume if it had not been
for your encouragement. Your
agreement in Melbourne was
that I continue the work with
your assistance & that the results
were to be published in our
joint names. I hold you to that
agreement. Old fellow, you took

hold it an honour to have my

mail certain. It appears to me
that I shall never get you
anything new & I am doubtful
whether it is worth your while
sending ~~this~~. You have got hold
of the marriage system plentifully
I could only find two or
three trifling errors in it which
are gone now more about it now
than I do. I could not have constructed
that table of pedigree without
getting bogged up terribly.
You must have the table of
Alpovia Class System it was
the first table I sent you after
returning, you acknowledged the
receipt by returning mail, it was
mailed in the first instance
Class System of Chilchica tribe

but I subsequently wrote you
saying that the name should
have been "Ispiora" Chitchie
means foreigner generally. If
you look through my papers
you will see that the Hyrcan
Class names were slightly different
their equivalent of Baetharra being
Cabbidgee. I can find no reason
for the difference in forms applied
to elder & younger sister amongst
the Cernla but since the lack
of relationship shows presumption
evident in a former state of
group marriage would it not be possible
that these names are a survival
of the old order of things when
they counted descent through the
mother? My conclusion of mine
drawn from conjecture would be

know to unsafe to base a theory upon but you with your trained scientific mind should be able to form a pretty correct idea how with reference to message sticks you say most undoubtedly message sticks are used in various parts of Australia? Perhaps so, I have no reason to doubt it but I most emphatically assert that such a thing as an "message stick" pure & simple does not exist amongst these people. What they ordinarily have are the non engineering bushmen & their message sticks are Grata. I have prised this up to the hell a hundred times - I have seen & examined the Grata carried by Innwana. Corley is a belander in the message stick - looking patiently

listened to his account of message sticks when he was here but in view of my lately acquired want of patience I did not say anything. Stirling also believed in the message stick theory & I daresay we shall see pages devoted to that myth in the Horn volume - No there is no question of their having once used message sticks since the advent of the white man dropped them - Perhaps it is not altogether a misnomer to call the Erula a message stick since they are used by messengers - they are the credentials of a messenger - they serve to show his bona fides - You know so much about Chirungs & their uses that I cannot understand

You having a knowledge of telegraph

Now as to Maguire's fore said
I have never seen that the Indians
do not use smoke signals that
I did say & still maintains after
years of exhaustless enquiry is
that they have no organized code
of smoke signals - They do arrange
to put up smoke signals on
certain occasions for instance
recently these people before going
on a war expedition arranged
to make smoke on the St. J. prays
Roughs when they were returning.
These smokes were made - not in
any special form - the people here
have two days before they returned
that the Expedition was on the
way back - If they'd never occurred

to them to let the smoke taste
and expect from its colour that
there was no arrangement whereby
the success or non-success of the
expedition could be signalled — In
my Horn notes I stated that whilst
prearranged signals are often made
but coded smoke signals exist
only in the minds of stooges
like Maguire & Horanap like who
know so much more about the
Native than mere Bushmen like myself
it has for years been a source
of wonder to me that the natives
make such little use of smoke
signals, how sometimes one native
will be waiting day after day
for a party from Andover or
Bonds Springs or the Barst
they never know when to expect

their visitors whereas if they
 had an organized signal system
 they would be saved a lot of
 trouble & expense - To my dear
 Professor Horrocks nothing in the
 message cipher or smoke signal fed
 Conde spent an afternoon &
 evening with us & I enjoyed his
 talk immensely we sat up late
 about 1 am Your character was
 packed to pieces very thoroughly
 & on the whole you come out
 of the ordeal very well, from
 what he says I know what kind
 of temper he has & I am
 still inclined to think that
 in the Switche we have a bad
 people without classes - they have
 Ochniamashila & I am now trying
 to discover if people of the

I am going out to the Mission Station in a week or ten days
probably to make official inspection
of the Niggers there but in
reality in search of anthropological
material. I have written the
Museum asking them to number
as many negroes as possible.
Yesterday I heard that they are
already assembling & that they
have a large amount of native
implements to offer me. I
shall take the no cameras &
probably get a ceremonial picture
or two - have some hopes of
getting the honey ant mitehama.
I have discovered that there are
female Railltchana in that
locality tho' something else


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never heard of before & I am
now anxious to investigate it.
I wish you could be with me.
There is no possible chance of
my getting to the Geo Gas
Range with you & Circle & I
don't see how it is possible
for Byrne to get away either
unless he sacrifices the loss
of a horse to which he is
entitled. I shall be ~~at~~ ^{anxiously} disappointed
if you don't come
here but of course I know that
you must go where you expect
to find the best results - Why
should not the Bart plain work
of here be folded in our forms
of life? it is practically
unexplored in that respect, in
fact not a single bear of any sort

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has gone to you from that quarter
Note The Apwra have adjoin the
Arunta on the latter's North west

In addition to attending to these
matters I have to maintain
a conversation with Prof Geologist
Brown who is here en route
for the Gold fields where the first
Incomplete erecting a public crushing

You will notice that I have left
some of your questions unanswered
I have been too busy this
mail to get through the lot.
You will see that I have traced
the C.W. marriage system right
through to Alice Springs I think

established a connecting link

very popular & you will note
that it is only performed
with the consent or by request
of the husband. I am inclined
to think that the custom is in
process of extinction. I cannot
learn of an instance in which
it has taken place in recent
years - Would the adoption of
a more comprehensive code of
relationship & class systems ~~lead~~
~~help~~ with descent through the
father tend naturally to the
extinction of such a custom?
I am inclined to think it would
The fact that every man

to whom I spoke about the
subject appearing to be ashamed
of it has led me to take
this conclusion - Now in the
Custom is fully recognized,
as at Charlotte Hatters for
instance, I never found that
there was any reluctance in
speaking about it - The old men
say the blacks never liked it.
I am still unable to find
a house of exchange of money
& intend going into the thing
very fully out at the
Mission Station - if it exists
that I cannot escape me -
How many of the freedom
negatives do you want one
or the three? with reference
to the Quapaw Ulysses

my accessory role was suddenly
burned at the last moment &
I failed to express myself clearly.
The Adnoringeta were the neighbours
of the Ulpimota who occupied
a strip of country between here to
Oren Springs - The ceremony has
nothing whatever to do with the
returning of Curinga & the
Ulpimota were not Adnoringeta
at all but of the Plum tree
Oshwamodella. I am still working
on this subject but have nothing
new to report except that the
Ceremony or Quapava is not confined
to this group but is performed
by groups who adjoined the
Ulpimota on the South - they were
looked down upon by the Adnoringeta
because of their refusal to undergo

the medicinal robes - There is no
special time for performing the
ceremony & on the occasion upon
which I saw it, it was performed
out of compliment to the visitors
from the same country who had
never seen it. Neither women or
children are permitted to see it
nor are they permitted to see
the ~~and~~ ^{the} ~~Wutongja~~ - I was thinking of
sending this to you but I am
afraid it would not stand the
knocking about in transit - by
next mail I shall have gathered
full particulars. I am now
working on the paintings on
rocks - I am not at all sure that
you will find the Urapanna
table complete the time at my
disposal was very limited & I had

not gone through it since - there
is no necessity to make a new
push table for Kylicko &
Warramanga the Arunta table
applies to also to Ilpirra,
Illeowra, Nglikko, Warramanga,
Nalparia & other tribes.
Am now in communication with
with an old friend of mine
Rev'd D'Althelop SJ who is ~~now~~
head of the Jesuit mission ~~now~~
on the Daly River but he
is at present visiting P'Darwin
& although he has been some
years amongst the blacks here
he knows nothing of their class
& marriage system he has he
tells me been for months struggling
with the intricacies of the ~~abor~~
to be. I told him something of the

system here & he has promised
to make inquiries the Lab Prot.
at Pt Darwin is also communicating
with me on the subject &
I hope to have some interesting
material shortly. I have an
idea that the system of the
Arunta & other Northam tribes
has gradually worked down from
the North & I am very curious
to find out the custom there now
McKedop says they don't permit
marriage between blood relations
but we know how misleading
this is when applied to blacks
Have you had any confabs with
Hornell or Fison about our
work lately? I must return some
of Mr Fison's pamphlets & expect to
mail the one relating to the

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The sacred stone enclosure of
Fiji is very interesting. I will
try to get good photo of
Medicine man. Womens Tongas
also of Lusock porcupine in time
for next mail. I have half a ton
of photographic material on
Cams expected daily. My gardener
knew an *Hyla selleni* array yesterday
but he has a temporary
hand back being array on sick leave
You shall have a sketch of the
frog from his as soon as we
can procure one to possess your

you want to know send along questions.
I shall if possible bind the
Missionaries over to word for as
if possible but they are not bound

kind of people to get much
information their policy is to
keep the blacks from their native
Customs & they do all they can to
stamp them out - I daresay some
of my inquiries will shock the
Rev. Gentleman but I shall not
let that stop me in any way. I
mean to go on & photograph the
Palms - So Horn is going to exclude
one of my introductory pictures, his
publishing the whole series was one
of the conditions upon which the
plates were sent to him, by the
way he or someone else in London
sent me the Journal of the Col.
Institute containing his Lecture. I
dareay you have seen it - I don't
think you need fear that the
Pursecute will use any of your

Photo without permission, he is not
 that sort of a man at all, he is
 using some of Scott Geologists
 Brown's pictures & some of mine
 including what one of the Horn
 Expeditions taken at Aranthe Gap -
 I hear he is probably going to
 the Northern Territory shortly to
 explore 50,000 miles of country recently
 taken up by an English Company
 for pastoral & mining purposes
 Does Horn clearly understand
 that he does not possess copyright
 of my notes? I sympathise with
 you in the anxiety & difficulties
 which you have to go through &
 I cannot but envy you the possession
 of a placid temperament & a dogged
 perseverance which seems to overcome
 all obstacles - without you there would

have been no Horn volume I
fancy Stirling would be glad
even now to withdraw his
contribution he fairly recognizes that
the great bulk responsibility of
the work has been thrown on your
shoulders & wonders that you have been
able to put up with Horn - By the
way Geology Brown tells me
that he believes Horn has not yet
settled up with Kinnane & Co. - This
is fact I don't want anything
from Horn & would much sooner
be without his album - I have
been reading your letter again,-
about the publishing do whatever
you think best short of involving
my expense I do not feel to incur
any risk in that aspect. I feel
sure if the worst come to the worst

that the South Australian Govt would
gladly undertake the publication
in the Govt printing establishment
Adelaide but in this case the
Govt would become Govt property &
perhaps not circulate much outside
the Colonies - he has had a visit
from a German scientist M.D & Ph.D
a geologist &c he has gone
on to Barrow's Creek & will stay
a week or two with me on his
return he was greatly interested
in my Anthro photos & never
tired of looking at them he
also evinced a curiosity ~~as~~ as
to Native habits in Carlow which
I did not encourage, he mentioned
the name of some great German
anthropologist I fancy it was Haeckel
& the ~~Geographical~~ Society of Berlin

is being anxious to learn something
of the habits & customs of these
blacks - A most interesting man
Mr. Johnson, unmistakably a ~~African~~
he has been a great deal in
Egypt & the Sudan & is altogether
an ~~Egyptian~~ ~~Arab~~ like individual he
deserves a perfect tritotite fossil
in limestone sandstone at ~~Borromana~~
I see now this discovery would fit
well in the old Savage - I wonder
will the old chap get his ~~far~~
while in England - Shapes so -
Conley was disgusted with my teetotal
fad & says it is engendered by
meanness! I confess I felt a bit
lonely while he was attacking my
solitary bottle of Whisky & I shall
certainly not allow you to drink

old & mature knowledge will be laid
in for your benefit - I don't like

as if we are never to see you
here again - how I wish another
