March 19, 1901.

Swollen hills  
Left at 10:30 am.  
Went to Chama & by  
Lugby stone on ahead the day  
before. Got 6 hours for  
Morrison to send at five int.  
Spoke of purchase at Ho a head.  
4 for payment + 2 for Wallace,  
4 in by lugby. 3 packs.  
2 pack bags went with Chama  
Warrick & Landa - the latter on  
his way back from Port Augusta  
after entrance for cattle stamping.  
Saw goodby to Mr. Ross. Next  
to back for sheep + water which had  
been supplied out. Outfit Chama  
at Swollen (hillparian) water.  
Went when camped. Left in  
refractory. Put up overnight tent.  
Found Alphas in water (very muddy)

Dbd. 680 ad.  
 CW 140. to ord.  
 CW 210. to Alia.

trying clearing plots, talking one  
 Man ste. by comfortable camp  
 spent 7 hrs which were so thick  
 as to make work impossible  
 50 bar ind. 144. fairly strong  
 S.E. wind + not very hot.  
 Saw my two birds a few places +  
 little else. My little animal life.  
 Only by and seen A. barbatum.  
 Sewer with Kangaroo here came up  
 late in aft.

March 20, 1911. Wednesday.  
 Tenent, am. 50.5. No 2 Wire Ck  
 up at sunrise. Breakfast 7.30. Packed  
 up ready to start but only 8 and 12 hours  
 to go. Wounded at 10. Tell  
~~10.~~ 10. This morning had some  
 heavy dew, night to clear. No  
 with rain. One pm in S. City in  
 regard to Cavalli Ste from a N.  
 Book of Cavalli's notes to the island

to a company in. Wered in uply  
Saggy party complete: he also asked  
us to be sure we were children  
Also tried to Sydney declining  
Up in wana as present to help.  
At day at 10-15 - I'd in sand  
Cuppy - travelled slowly on to  
Stone Creek wh. had muddy  
water. When all along it. Then on  
to mine creek where we found H.  
Lewis with horses. Had lunch with  
him. Then I pin sand my hat.  
Dyppie by tent + wrote in aft.  
Count all like plain only covered  
with pen pan - mostly tubular  
but probably print out rise.  
None at mine creek. too late to  
hold hand in.

Mars. 21. Monday. Tem. Temp. 51.5.

Left Wai Creek 8 am. crossed  
wide open well paved filler plain  
about 12 miles. Clay from dregs  
up in some places crumpled  
filled. Open - entana with a few  
Branchipora. A little water  
seen but most tubular with joints  
pottery, not set and hard.

Ground allays a when even plenty  
of water with open some of which  
had 12-12 water little hanging on  
to during them appearing. As  
in former occasion the open was  
many of them, struggling to get out  
the water on to the edge of the sand  
~~water~~ presumably to lay eggs.  
A few plants of Darling fisher near  
the creek. Filled itself with  
small lumps of Muggot - Barber  
crumpled. Sandy but chance with

heavy supply - Maroonan team  
 Mt Joggid. Sent back Liffner  
 & Kelly to Jaly plain  
 two team + then got through  
 P. Jey went on to New Maroon  
 at Macumba. traded the team  
 till Chase came up. Liffner climbed  
 with 2 'bug eyes' could not see  
 to drive so drove out for m -  
 camped on flat & fire water hole  
 in Stevenson due to Macumba.  
 Compassing put back at been  
 plowed, land. Liffner, Joly, Cross  
 + water hole. No water.

tent it started but came to dead  
stop in heavy sand along Steverson

C. Ryan an old mailman probably  
came with camel team & with  
his help loggy taken on a short  
distance to clay pan near River.  
Halted here & camped. No 10<sup>th</sup> man  
or available horse. Waiting for  
Machungie who is said to have horses.  
Put up by tent & tent for  
photograph.

with a few seed bins out again.  
Wrote pretty in camp.  
Cleaned two bumpy eggs fallen over.

Some 100 natives came up late in  
the aft. so after tea when fire had  
started for the night ~~for~~ got out  
phonograph took 12 cylinders.  
Saw 100 Eukita, Witches, Slopas,  
Wipukaballa(?), ~~some~~ Morning star,  
Uha! Uha! 2 Carua song southern  
& northern variants. Song of the  
Urumpilla (Soyoma), Sentences, Name  
of Uha. The natives much  
interested and excited. Went  
on to native camp later in the  
shad into then returned in.

Camp 4. Saturday. 2 1/2 mile north of  
Macumba. 1st night 6:30. after  
Mid. Sunset. 5:30.

5  
breakfast went to River & cleared some  
rain collecting in pools. 2 sp. soft coral  
one deep red column then slightly  
fused with red at ant. end. Cut to  
plentiful as deep red one (2 others  
*S. packardii*?), Tadpole of  
*Chironomus* platycephalus young ones of  
*L. stratus* hatching in the sand.  
*Cypris* in part. Spms. in adult frog.  
My birds about one per tree. Start  
one - white eye. Saw no. 495  
filled pot being eye.

March 24. Sunday

Camps. Ten. num. 48.5.

W. hope sunrise breakfast  
by plain awate. Part of  
Horn by timberline and plain.  
waited for Mackenzie with horse.  
He came about 10:30 & at 10:45  
started off but my buggy came  
to start till 30 yards from camp.



fall again after some trouble.  
 filled self paddled up in small  
 luggie with or two boxes. About  
 8 steps on the way with the  
 luggie - a great deal of  
 trouble. Road very heavy, sandy.  
 Maybe few pan-paragates.  
*Scypha variegata* (Stebbing) (specimen)  
*Anolis*. *Darbingtonia*. *Little*  
*Nerobius* in crevices. *Cryptus*,  
*Stenobothrus* *silvatus* very little sign  
 of animal life. No ant-eaters.  
 The awful seasonal print  
 camp 3:15. at valley well  
 distance 12 1/2 miles.

Native name. *Anthracoceros*.  
 (Bar near 138.5 of island p. 520-4)  
 Monday. *Mano* vs. *Monday*.  
 Camp 6. *Tom* vs. *Tom*.  
 At slope sunrise breakfast &  
 start at 7:45. Along Skinner all  
 day. *Carved* *each* *river* *with* *tin*.

Trask to Dallasville,

My luffery stuck out on the river train.  
Heard a saw 'emagine' for first time  
for night. Good point collection. Few  
seen for some nights. At night heard  
the water just whirly in the part at  
willow well.

Mostly make sure the pretty party  
who saw my first luffery to recover from  
the effect of the drought. From  
transported in flooded land. Daily the  
patches of meadow. This occurred  
around Alabama on the river  
& showed later. Several camps  
I saw. Found that little and few  
had been lost. Perhaps many  
survive from a big luffery when horses  
jumped at start in sandy creek.  
It was high down and safely.  
Ditto had started on him already  
when we did not pass him  
A late off. wandered along creek.





water pools drying up. Very few Abama  
 Solitaries - flocks of C. West. shrikes -  
 large numbers of many d. orioles on the  
 sand. Plenty of tracks of small  
 mammals probably bandicots.  
 In all. Hopkins with eggs & team of  
 14 horses came in.

 place about 4 Adams.

Still hardly any birds about :

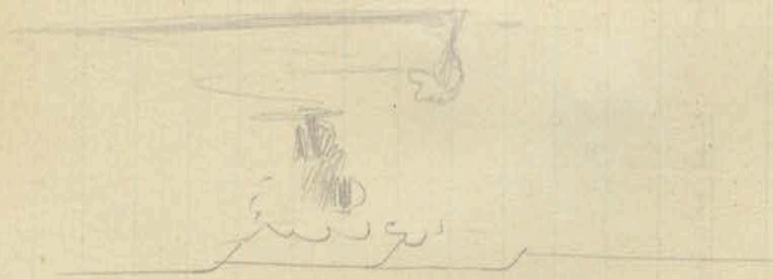

 water holes & shows trace of the  
 recent flood. Along to the  
 river from pine with pine trees was  
 bright with just green which  
 the grass around from started  
 out over the low lying land on  
 each side gradually rising away  
 as they go further & further away  
 from reach of water level in the  
 higher parts of the plate this place  
 is taken by *Pinus caroliniana* & *Juniperus*  
 The white trunk of the river pine

died is used for the purpose of

make the sand not so hot as to be
