Dear General Pitt-Rivers,

I have had interviews with

has asked me to again see him

This I have done and he now has
decided to leave the House during

at Portsmouth so as to be able
to do this but with the understanding
that you are to release ^{him} of his
tenure of the House and take it
off his hands at which time his formal
tenure of the whole is to cease
but the occupation of the House would

be given up as soon as he vacates it,
I am to see him again and go
further into the matter on either
Tuesday or Wednesday morning next -
On the latter day I am leaving home
for Boston until Saturday night -
but I will go to Annetown on my
return from there unless I hear from
you to the contrary -
