We are now thinning & tipping
the Larches in Siddlewood at
which you looked when there and
in the coppice at the lower side
of Stinton which you pass on
your way from Rushmore & where
you saw the wood was cut it
requires about 13 or 14 taken out

there & to which I presume there
can be no objection which I shall
have done unless I hear to the
contrary -
