I have made enquiries from our Foreman-of-Works who took down the carved windows and he informs me that these were complete with the exception of the small piece marked with ink which you will remember was missing when you saw them. Mr Bradley must evidently have mixed up some portions of these windows with the other woodwork as none was left behind and I feel sure you will find the missing pieces amongst them.

I return herewith your drawing. I am pleased to hear that the 3 Statues reached you safely. I cannot give you any description of them. The only person I know likely to be able to do this would be Dr. Leitner at Woking, or Sir George Birdwood at the India Office. They were sent to us from Bombay.
