- (1). Outside measurement of book,  $16\frac{1}{2}$  inches by  $12\frac{1}{4}$  inches.
  - (2). All the letters in the Alphabet are to be included, and two sheets (4 pages) of paper are to be allotted to each letter.
  - (3). Pale blue foolscap paper to be used.
  - (4). Each page is to be ruled with 34 faint horizontal lines.
  - (5). Each page is to be ruled with red ink perpendicular lines, as shown on the enclosed sheet.
- It will be seen that there are 10 columns.

When one book is made, please send it, in order that I may see that it is right, before the others are commenced.

Let me know if there is anything you do not understand. I cannot send a book as a pattern, because we are constantly using them.
