The photos 6 in number were left at 4 Grosvenor Gardens about end of February with a letter advising them and stating I

had ordered a Kaldwin Iron Strick which afterwards I sent on.

I paid Messrs Skein & Co of Regent the photographs 12/- for the photos same as charged to you

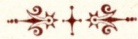
