Sir,

In reference to the conversation we had with you we have written to Berlin in order to get an estimate of the Chromos required.

We have just received an answer informing us that our Berlin house which would be ready to undertake the doing up of the plates with the utmost care, cannot



make any calculation considering the price unless they have seen the drawings or at least one of them.

The price depends entirely upon the variety of colors and the difference of a plate requiring 15 colorprints would be considerable against one of 9 colors only. To give you an estimate without having seen the drawings would therefore have the effect of either quoting a price too low considering the number of colors required or on the other hand you might be deterred by a calculation

based on a larger number of printings than wanted for your purpose.

We therefore should feel greatly obliged if you would kindly forward us the drawings or a part of them. We shall send them at once to Berlin taking the greatest care in packing etc. and will give you a correct estimate a few days afterwards.
