Sir We should be obliged if you would let us know if you have been able to arrange the particulars, and the order of the photographs for the album.

We shall shortly be very busy with work intended for the Royal Academy, and if possible we should like to complete the album before that time.

If you will not be coming to town, we should be glad to wait upon you at

Rushmore, if it would facilitate the matter. We find that the cost of making the negatives only of your 319 subjects including attendances at Rushmore on 3 occasions (occupying 21 days), and at your London house on 15 days is about £128. 0.0 comprising 8. 15" x 12", 1. 10" x 8", 63. 8" x 6" and 247. 6" x 4" negatives.

As this part of the work was done from February to June of last year we should esteem it a great favour if you could send us a cheque or account of this part of the work.
