Butter at present in this  
locality makes from 14<sup>d</sup> to 16<sup>d</sup>  
per lb, there is not much  
dairy sold locally but what there  
is makes about 3<sup>d</sup> per quart  
or 3<sup>d</sup>/ for a dozen quarts and  
wholesale to a dealer for the  
London markets it makes about

$2\frac{0}{3}$  to  $2\frac{0}{6}$  per dozen quarts.

Straw is now cheaper than  
for some years past & makes  
in place from  $30\frac{0}{1} =$  to  $35\frac{0}{1} =$   
a ton -

I have written to Mr. Hamby  
& in reply he says "I did not  
"think of exchanging my land on  
"Winchington I am a Major General  
"St. Rivers asked me if I would  
"sell it, as he should like to buy

"it, I do not think of selling it  
"but we might come to some  
"arrangement about an exchange"

I have now written him asking  
him in what I wish he would  
take land in lieu of his -
