Dear Sir,

In the valuable record of your excavations in the South Lodge Camp, which I have just read you mention a bronze looped spear head, and quote an example figured by Dr. Thurnam from Wilsford, Wilt.

The locality is an error, and it was not, strictly speaking, found in a barrow. I trouble you with the particulars, as you may be glad to correct the mistake.  
My grandfather, Mr. Cunningham

found this implement in group  
14 near Stonehenge 1. (near the  
Barrow in which the large  
"Stonehenge" urn was found) <sup>im-</sup>  
mediately under the turf. He  
mentions it as being similar to  
one figured in Gough's Camden III.  
pl. 39. fig. 3 - It is in the Wiltshire  
Museum at Devizes. The original  
drawing of it is in my possession.

The circumstances of this find  
quite confirm your views as to  
the age of these weapons -

There is another specimen of  
the same form ~~in~~ in the Wiltshire  
Museum, which was found just  
under the turf, on the open downs  
near Beckhampton.
