Clerks of the Estate Office - who
I happen fortunately to be a keen
archaeologist -

Everything is being carefully watched
on your principles - but I

do not believe any definite evidence
will be discovered - The bank is
nearly everything & cut through
at the extent of original surface
exposed can only at best be very
small.
