I called this eve. to lay before you the views of the Parish Council as to the further improvement of the well in Water Street, by the exclusion of some surface water which at present finds its way into it (a fact to which the County Analyst calls attention in his report upon it). To do

this it will be necessary
to rebuild a portion of
the present wall of the
well, raise it and cover
it in: and at the same

to provide a windlass and
bucket.
