Dear Sir

I enclose two small reprints from the Cardiff Naturalists transactions on a Roman Villa and other Ancient Remains which I found about a mile from Llandaff and three miles from Cardiff, I furnished the Cardiff Naturalists Society with a report which would have occupied about 30 to 35 pages of print but I find that they have not published it, and I am now arranging for its publication elsewhere, and will send you a copy when it is out.

The most interesting point up to the present is the remains of ancient steel making, curiously enough by the plan of decarbonization lately re-discovered and known as the Bessemer process but which after all is by far the simplest and most direct process.

Mr. Martin, Managing Director of Dowlais Iron & Steel works has taken a great interest in the discovery and I think that through his efforts we will be able to know more of Roman steel working than has been known before.

It is possible that you may have forgotten my name, I found a Roman villa near Glantworth Major which you were kind enough to come down and see about 7 years ago.
