Dear Sir

I have to thank you
very much for taking so kindly
a matter about which I feared
you might well have been angry

Of course Lady Russell & her
Grace have no other wish than

of your family.

As I was lying awake the
night after I wrote to you it
came into my mind that
someone told me in 1884

and see for ourselves what has
been done. I shall be at home
next week on Monday Tuesday
& Wednesday till the evening &
on Friday & Saturday, if you
would like to come up & be present
on the occasion, we expect the
new station at Bramley to be
open on Wednesday which is
only 3 miles from here. I would send
them or to Mortimer to meet you.

regret that I did not write to you
in 84 & ask you to have the vault
secured. But I knew there was
nothing of value in it & I never
thought of anyone doing so foolish
& wicked a thing.
