Dear Sir,

Mr. Giffard Le Messurier, of this island, informs us that during a visit to England, from which he has just returned, he had the pleasure and privilege of making your acquaintance, and also of examining your very interesting museum, and going over your beautiful estate.

He says, too, that in a conversation with you respecting our Institution (the Guille-Allie's Library & Museum) you were kind enough to offer to send us some of your publications on archaeological matters. We beg to thank you most sincerely for your kind and generous thought, and shall be very glad indeed to receive anything with which you may be good enough to favour us.

On behalf of Mr. Guille, the original founder both of this Library and of the

newly-opened Artisan's Institute, I beg to send you by this same post a couple of descriptive pamphlets from which you will see the character of the work we are doing, and which is proving a valuable acquisition to the intellectual life of our insular community.

We have in the island, as you are probably aware, a number of interesting cromlechs and other megalithic remains, which many years ago were carefully examined by the late Dr. Lubbock, whose son, Captain Lubbock, still has the proceeds of the excavations in his private museum, and a very valuable collection they form. Dr. Lubbock also contributed, at the time of his investigations, various illustrated papers respecting his "finds" to Archaeologia, and to the Journals of the Archaeological Association and the Archaeological Institute, which communications you have doubtless seen.
