Dear Sir In reply to your letter  
of the 24 Oct, I think that local  
societies could not be better  
employed than in the manner  
suggested by Mr. Meldola in  
his paper, in forming a list  
and a map of local antiquities  
including the minor prehistoric  
ones. Many of these are  
really likely to yield more

information in the future than  
those which are better known  
and have been more carefully  
studied. Such a work would be  
of great assistance to me as the  
Government Inspector and I  
shall be happy to be in  
communication with your  
society on the subject, and to  
receive from them information  
about local monuments  
which it may be thought  
desirable to preserve.

Maps and lists of the kind  
referred to have been published  
by Mr. C. Warne for Worseshire  
and by Mr. G. B. Witts for  
Gloucestershire. The map of  
the latter however is rather  
a confused one and I think  
it would be better if possible  
to stamp the antiquities on  
the Ordnance inch sheets.
