THE MARK OF THE CROSS WITHIN A CIRCLE, ROUGHLY INSCRIBED WITH THE POINT OF THE FINGER, APPEARS UNDOUBTEDLY TO BE THE CHRISTIAN EMBLEM USED BY THE ROMANS IN THIS PART OF ENGLAND, AND WHICH PREVAILS ON STONE CROSSES IN THE SOUTH AND WEST OF GREAT BRITAIN.

IT HAS ALSO THE IMPRESSION OF A DOG'S FOOT.
