know of the existence of a  
bed of lower green and deposited  
at your Oxford Fitzhara  
Grate-field. I have been to  
see it twice & am a  
correspondance with Mr Webster  
of the British Museum who  
will bring it before the  
Geological Society. It is  
overlain by a strata bed of

very soft porous Gault, from  
which it is divided by a  
bed of hard rock also fine-  
topped & a bed of bituminous  
colored quartz-felds. The  
remains, probably of an earlier  
series. Mr Fisher Brown  
found the lower green in  
the Vale of Masham for  
the first time about 3  
years ago. This is its Western  
extent in. If I am a day
