you were
so extremely kind sometime ago
to write to Sir A Woodlston Franks
on my behalf when I was a
candidate for the vacancy in
his department. Unfortunately
I had to compete against a
strong linguist and did not
succeed in the competitive examination.
I am applying for the Lectureship

in Geography at Owen's College
Manchester, and it would be
a very great kindness if you
could mention my name to
Professor W Boyd Dawkins who
has considerable influence there.
I have been working a good
deal at the Anthropological side
of Geography and have done
a considerable amount of
Geographical lecturing.
During the last year and a
half I have made what I
think I may call a conspicuous

success of the teaching of Geography
to large classes of about 100
by means of slides diagrams and
maps shown with a lantern, &c.
at St Clare's Grammar School
Southwark. I have also been
telling a Modern class of which
I have the sole control very
largely in Geographical subjects.
I do not like to trouble you
but you were so very kind in
interesting yourself on my behalf
before, that I feel I might
ask you for another great
