Dear Sir

I shall be extremely obliged if you will kindly correct an error which appears in the County Chronidle of this week, where I am reported to have said at the Salisbury Meeting of the Natural History and Antiquarian Field Club, that when the successor of paloeolithic man appeared on the scene that "he had no domestic animal, no pottery, and that he had shown himself to be an artist".
