Dear Sir In letter-writing I fear
that brevity is not one of my
characteristics, but I will on
this occasion endeavour to be
as brief as possible.

I am thoroughly happy in
the County of Dorset, and should
not care to remove elsewhere
to any part of the British Isles,
except perhaps one, and that is
the Isle of Man - I have known
the Isle of Man well, over the
last twenty years, and have

preached in some of the Churches there. On that island is a living I have coveted for nearly all that time. That living is now vacant; the Rector died last Sunday 28 July - It is in the gift of the Crown, that is, in Mr. Gladstone's gift. Its net value is a little over £600 per ann. Although Crown livings are usually almost immediately filled, I do not think that Mr. Gladstone has yet appointed any one to this, though no doubt he will have numerous applications.

I fear in writing what follows I am guilty of a

piece of stupendous presumption, but if I am taking too great a liberty - I beg to offer every apology, and I at once respectfully retire, casting myself entirely on your indulgence, and hoping for your kind and generous forgiveness.

I am one of Sir John Lubbock's constituents, that is a Graduate of London University, for which he is M.P. (Many I remark by the way that the present Lord Chancellor is also one of his constituents, being a Graduate of London University.)
