answering yours. The skeleton

This is all I can tell you.

Excepting that as soon as the
head of the pick struck
up, but only to find the skull
in bits & the thighbone flung
broadcast. We turned over the
chalk & earth, & result is, the
collection of bones, & nails
which I am to send to Pitt
Rivers. From since found
out, that on several occasions
bones have been turned up.
