It has been suggested to  
me that you might like  
to acquire a collection of  
necklaces & strings of beads  
which I made last winter  
in Upper Egypt.

The necklaces are of various  
substances, from beads of  
Amethyst, garnet, & Carnelian  
& knots of twisted glass.

and some of them of rare of  
ancient Egyptian glass beads  
with others of the Greek  
& Roman periods, & exemplifying  
imitations of hard stones  
such as plasma & lapis.

The beads represent a  
great variety of Egyptian  
forms in porcelain.  
In addition to those from  
Egypt there are 3 necklaces  
of amber & glass from  
Southern Italy.  
I have also a small collection  
of objects of gold, - rings,

amulets, pendants as from
