Dear Sir

I hope I shall not do  
wrong in bringing under your notice  
an appeal which the Society of Antiquaries  
in Newcastle is making for  
funds to enable them to make a  
thorough excavation of the Roman  
Camp at Borewicks (House-stand)  
I mentioned the matter a few months  
ago to the Society of Antiquaries in  
London & received from them a grant

of £20. but was advised to  
get all I could from local sources  
before going elsewhere. I have now  
raised about £400 by hard  
begging among my Northumbrian  
acquaintances & see little prospect  
of raising any more in the County.  
We have had a most interesting  
summer campaign, not so much  
because of special antiquities discov-  
ered by us. (though there have not  
been wanting.) as because we are now  
~~able~~ from our excavations to recon-  
struct almost the entire plan of the

Camp, especially are able to plan  
the prætorium in the Centre of the  
Camp. It is to have been a build-  
ing surrounded with a Colonnade,  
the really noble bases of which are  
still for the most part visible.

All this must soon be hope to  
give to the world in a full report,  
to be published before the end of the  
year. But our funds are still  
about £100 short of the desired amount.  
If I might have the benefit of your  
advice, to whom in the South of England  
I should apply for aid to this (which
