Dear Sir

I am most grateful
to you for so kindly taking
upon yourself the repair of
the monuments. Humanly
speaking they will not now
need touching again for
another century. I shall
certainly propose at our
Easter Vestry a vote of thanks
to you. I have written to
Mess Wreddie by this post

to commence the work
if possible next week.

There are two inscriptions
in Brass to the D Abudgeworts
who were the predecessors
of the Pells; - The Monument
of Sir William & Lady Pell; -
that of Mr George Pell (with
a great deal of information
in it about the family) &
the monument by Chantry
to the first Lord Rivers
The Duchefs of Wellington
told me that she had
the other day picked up
a likeness of Lord Rivers &

that it bore a strong
resemblance to the figure
on the tomb monument. And
Her Grace thought perhaps that
the female figure might
represent Lady Rivers

We have no monument
to the second Lord Rivers
But the interest of the £100
which he left to the poor
of the Parish is year by year
distributed by the Churchwarden
& myself to the best of our
ability together with the
gift of Mr George Pell his
wife & his sister. $\frac{3}{4}$ th of
