Dear Sir,

Justice in the map (Plate CLX)
in your ⁱⁱⁱrd vol of excavations that
Pen Pit is marked as a spot ex-
amined by you. Might I ask you
to give me the reference to the acc-
ount of these excavations as I have
missed it some time since when
I took it up. May I also ask
you whether any Roman tile can
be assigned to Redspole. The dis-
coveries of Roman pottery in the
Weymouth back water would
seem to make some light in
taking it as the Ro. Seaport to Dor-
chester. The curators at Dorchester

Museum (whose name I have written) had
me thank the donor this was correct.
I hesitate to ask it, but if you have
such a thing as a spare copy of
your map of ancient Dorset, with the
Somerset & could give it me, it would
be a great treat to me - I am deeply
interested in these countries which I
frequently visit & I have Waverley &
Scarth's maps [the obtaining of which
I've made a deal of trouble] but
yours it is impossible for me to
get for myself unless you should
have a spare copy with which you
could endorse me - May I also ask,
do you think, with Waverley, that Oldenburg is
Danish? I must confess I lean to the Roman
view - & do you think it safe to run
down the "ferme point" as probably (almost
certainly) Celtic - with many apologies
