2 Norman pots from Cologne
interesting because they are very like
similar ones made in Britain. one
is a pretty shape & is just like a number
one in the British Museum. They represent
very well the provincial ware of the
Normans & show how close imitated the

These were to each other in Norman times.

3 a curious wooden disc with a narrow & narrow
on one side and a mucousal part on the other
probably early 17th century & used for stamping
cakes.

4. 2 pots which I think curious one is of the
form which was used at Cologne in early times and has
impressed patterns. They are very when perfect. The other

is of Treker ware with oak leaves etc in relief. I've
well we had the last of each rings nearly the same.
