I have inspected the  
supposed Roman road  
and do not feel quite  
satisfied about it. I

all the important points

I will let you know. There  
is no mention of a Roman  
road at Tarrant Water  
in Warner's Map. I don't  
think British roads were  
stoned or appear to be  
the case in this instance  
hoping you derived some  
benefit from Cal. had  
I remain
