Dear General Pitt Rivers,

I take the liberty of asking for your votes in the Royal Agricultural Benevolent Socy for Mrs Louisa Blomfield, whose card I enclose, provided they are not already promised. I know her case to be a deserving one.

I do not remember whether I mentioned to you as deserving your official care two of the circles near Aberdeen, concerning which I read a paper last Tuesday at Hanover Sq.

One is at Tyrebezzar Mill,
near Dyce Junction, Aberdeenshire,
and is in very good condition; and
the other is the only one remaining
in a good condition out of four in
the parish of Banchoy Devenick,
Kincardineshire, $7\frac{1}{2}$ m S from
Aberdeen.

The latter is described
as the Anchorthis Circle by Mr A.
Thomson, in the Proceedings of the Socy
of Antiquaries of Scotland, June 1863,
Vol V, p 130, and also by the Rev Dr
Garden in 1692 in a letter to Aubrey
published in Archaeologia Vol 1 p 312
whose description is also quoted in
Gough's edition of Camden's Britannia
As the best of four it ought not to be
allowed to be damaged more than it is
