Dear General Rivers,

We have raised funds,
according to promises received,
sufficient to allow of
a Meat Tea here for
all the Parish on the
27th inst, and the
Committee are now
soliciting gifts of faggots
for the bonfire on Winkellbury.
It is estimated that

about 400 faggots will
be required. Can you
kindly help us by sending
some to the spot where
the bonfire is to be, viz.
half way between the
cemetery on Winkellany
Hill and the opening
of the rampart? If
sent there within the next
ten days there will be
time for the bonfire to be
properly constructed before

the 21st. One of the
members of our Committee
understands the way
to make it so as to
allow of its being seen
to the best advantage.
If you can help us in this
the Committee will be much
obliged.
