Is there anything
known of "Saxoubery"
in the parish of Grant,
near here? I obtained
permission from
Lord Gen Nevill to over-
look the place & found
on the summit of
the hill a bank had

been thrown up about
3 feet high & 320
paces in circumference,
the vallum from whence
the earth had been
dug being on the outside.
The significant name
attracted me to
the spot. If you
know of any other
suspicious places
requiring a watchful

eye in this locality
I should be glad to
hear, if not troubling
you too much —
I am investigating
the neighbourhood
of Plastol not far
from Oldbury, the
fields about there
seem full of Roman
remains. I find
there are some very
