I found that the men
at Lodge's quarry had
today got as far as the
old floor of the cave.

The soil of the last 6 inches
was much mixed with
charcoal but I could see
nothing else. The men

have orders to go on clearing
some ground down to the
charcoal, till you come, which
will I hope be tomorrow
afternoon. I must go back
to Bournemouth, but the
men can (when you have
looked at the place) sink
deeper, or not, as you may
direct them.

I don't think Skirt's picture

your attention. But I am
no judge whatever.

think it worthy of further
