Dear Gen. Pitt-Rivers

I was sorry to miss
you when you called here
on Saturday. I have examined
the Autlers you left and have
succeeded in two or three in-
stances to put portions together
so make the fragments more
perfect. I find that they are
all bones of Corvus elaphus

the Red Deer. I have been able to determine the position of the antler of each fragment composed and have attached labels. The very much flattened fragment is quite the terminal portion of the antler which must have been of very large size.

My paper went off very well at Manchester though the time at my disposal was rather limited & the discussion on it had to be short

It was fairly well reported in the Times & will probably through that medium reach many who would not otherwise have heard much of your excavations & the finds made. I shall return the antlers to you immediately arrived as directed to Rushmore.
