

that he considers the Remains as
Romano-British. I do however
humbly differ from him especially
since I have seen your collection from
the Romano-British hilltops in your own
neighbourhood, our collection agrees
much better with the objects you obtained
from Mr Caborn; the collection as a
whole may I think be dated as belonging
to Mr Frank's Late-Celtic Period. It is
much to be regretted that the digging
was not superintended by a committee
each one taking his turn and making
notes, as doubtless much valuable
information has been allowed to escape.
I will forward you Sir Henry's Paper next
week.

Dear Sir,

Thank you for your letter received
this morning, I was sorry to find you away
from Rushmore when I was in Dorsetshire
I think you would have been pleased with
the pottery from Sausi Camp, of which
I now send some rough sketches, I showed
them to Mr Read when I went through
Toson & he considers them to be Late-Celtic
I saw a few fragments in the Blackmore
Museum, from the Highfield Pits near
Salisbury the ornamentation on which
was similar to some of ours. I also enclose
my copy of Sir Henry Sydney's Paper if you
have not already seen it you will see

Portions of nearly 150 querns

Remains of probably 400 to 500 coarse hand made pots of different shapes and sizes (plain).

Some fragments of bowl-shaped vessels with scroll and other incised ornamentation, these seem to have had more care bestowed upon them.

No remains of any pottery turned on the wheel

Iron Spear Heads No slit in the sockets some agree in shape with those found at Marin & figured in Keller's Swiss Lake-Dwellings

Iron Knives some with handles of deer horn

Iron dagger in iron sheath (late-celtic type)

Iron sword with remains of Bronze sheath

Portion of 2 or 3 Iron sheaths

Bronze sheath ornamented with late-celtic pattern very similar to pattern engraved on back of mirror from Cornwall

Portions of Wheel Tires

Iron Saws (3) with equilateral teeth

Iron articles of domestic use, such as Pot-hooks etc

Miscellaneous Iron articles

Bronze fibula (late celtic)

Remains of 2 Bronze fibulae.

Bronze rings similar to rings found at Porden Hill.

Bronze objects belonging to horse trappings

Spindle Whorls & Bone combs similar to one found at W. Caborn

3 Bones of Shields 2 are similar to those attributed to the Saxons

1 coin of Constantine
various miscellaneous articles in horse etc
