Dear Mrs Rivers,

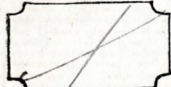
General Rivers sent me

Dear Sir,

I further reply to your letter of the 10th instant re Howorth's parcel. I beg to inform you that I have had the matter fully investigated and I find the parcel was tendered to consignee's address at 9 Hereford Square on Sept 3rd but as Consignee had left the parcel could not be delivered and it was returned by Leamington to the East Property Office Nottingham and there remained till it was forwarded on to Howorth

Bentcliffe Leeds Manchester on December 10th and I find the parcel was duly delivered to Howorth at Leeds Manchester on December 12th and signed for by Howorth on that date. It is quite evident the information received by you as to the parcel having been lying at Consignee's address in Leamington the whole of the time is not correct.
