I find the Paper by Mr.
Hudleston is earlier than I had
thought. It is in No: 130
of the Quarterly Journal, published
May 1st 1877 - The exact
title of the paper being "On
the Corallian Rocks of England
by Rev^d. S. F. Blake, and W. H.

"
Rudleston Bay."

The section at Sturminster,
to which I referred is given on
page 276, the oolitic marl
(No. 6) occurring at the bottom of
the cutting.

I purpose sending you
a fragment of the "Chalk Rock"
from this neighbourhood, so that
you may compare it with the
pieces you have from the small
pit on the road to Ashcombe.

For if a cleared exposure
of the "Chalk Rock" should be
opened out near Rushmore,
it would be a most useful
horizon.

I have enjoyed my visit
very much, and am obliged
to you for showing me
your extremely interesting
country.
