You may remember that the writer showed you an Italian bronze ornament (evidently being an inkstand from the sixteenth century) some kind ago. I have not been able to communicate with my Danish friend ^{who owns it} before now when he says he is willing to take £.5- for it. This price I should say is cheap, & if you desire it, I will submit the ornament for your inspection again. I herewith also beg to draw your attention to what is said to be the largest olhorn in the world. It measures more than five feet along the surface & more than six inches across the opening (of the horn itself, the mounting being 8 1/2 inch. across)

It is well polished, & mounted in
German Silver. By the enclosed
photograph you can form an idea
of how it looks; it being a
grand & unique ornament.
