MEMORIAL

TO THE LATE

CANON J. E. JACKSON, F.S.A.

Proposed Addition to the Wiltshire Archæological Society's Museum.

At the last Annual Meeting of the Wilts Archæological and Natural History Society it was decided to issue an appeal for Subscriptions to raise a permanent Memorial to the late CANON JACKSON, whose life was occupied in work by which the Society and the whole County of Wilts has so largely benefited. It was agreed that the most suitable form that such a Memorial could take would be an addition to the Society's Museum, where at present the space is so limited that even the fine Collection of Fossils bequeathed by the late Canon himself cannot be exhibited at all.

A Drawing of the proposed new "JACKSON GALLERY" by Mr. C. E. Ponting, F.S.A., is given on the preceding page.

To carry this out some £700 will be needed—towards which at present £160 has been given or promised. The Committee therefore earnestly appeal for further Subscriptions, not merely to Members of the Society, but to all who value the late Canon's work, or who care for the History and Antiquities of the County of Wilts.
