at Larmer but if so & you wd care to  
see a builder I wd bring one up with  
me, please giving him distinctly to  
understand that it would be a  
competition job & the lowest would  
have the work

by O'Brien (Mr Herbert however resumes  
the editing next month). I hope you  
may find time to glance through  
"Schemes of Social Democrats" &  
"Self Reliance & Fear" & as it is
