same time to two Japanese pots.
J. 125 is from the "Gowland hole"
which he made in Japan. The precise

No more specimens are the best
as the Government has stopped all
excavations in old tombs; at least
to say Mr Basil Hale Chamberlain.

The other specimens is from the
collection made by Siebold the
youngest & is nice on account of the
remains of glass in the wood; said
to be due to the wood used in baking.

It was found at Tambo-ichi
Province of Yamato & may be
even older than the other.
