you would care to become purchaser.

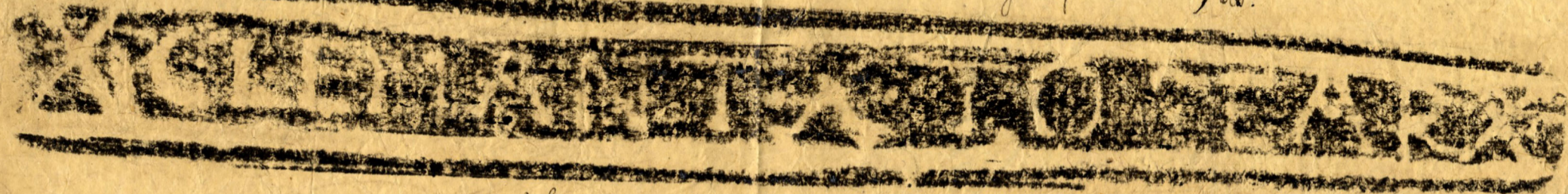
