My dear Sir.

during the last five or six years
I have been investigating some river
gravels near here & have ^{found} over
a hundred stone implements, mostly
of quartzite. I hope before long
to be able to communicate an
account of these to the Geological
Society of London, & exhibit a
selection of them.

Above the implement layer
I have also discovered some hundred
of fragments of very ancient pottery
- some of it possibly prehistoric.

Unfortunately I know no one who
is an authority on this subject, & can
only find the most meagre
references in print. I am told
you have published several
volumes giving an account of
your own researches in this
direction, & probably information
of much value to me.

I can find no record of them in
such catalogues as I have access to,
& I should esteem it a very great
kindness if you would be so good
as to inform me respecting the
publisher and price of your volumes,
& also whether my information as
to their contents is correct.
