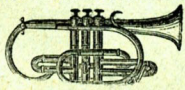

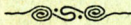

The Committee of above Band herewith respectfully forward a Balance Sheet and direct me to offer for your perusal an outline of adopted Band Rules, —thus, Each recruit is subjected to a two months course of training, and according to result is retained or rejected, and when considered by Bandmaster competent to publicly perform, is enrolled (upon payment of 2/6 entrance fee)

as a member. A committee of five are annually appointed to conduct business matters, and a Treasurer to hold and a Secretary to balance financial matters. Members subscriptions of £ weekly and public subscriptions purchase Instruments, Music, and Uniform. Engagements and Christmas cash are equally divided amongst Band. A collection of rules are in Secretarys hands and will be printed as soon as funds permit, for distribution among members and subscribers who wish a copy. I am further directed to say that that should it be Gen. Pitt-Rivers wish to hear the Band at any time, they would, if possible to assemble, have much pleasure in coming to Rushmore for the purpose.
