

as a member. A committee of five are annually appointed to conduct business matters,  
and a Treasurer to hold and a Secretary to balance financial matters. Members subscriptions  
of £ weekly and public subscription purchase Instruments, Music, and Uniform.  
Engagement and Christmas cash are equally divided amongst Band. A collection of rules  
are in Secretary's hands and will be printed as soon as funds permit, for distribution  
among members and subscribers who wish a copy. I am further directed to say that  
that should it be you Pitt-Rivers' wish to hear the Band at any time, they would, if possible to  
assemble, have much pleasure in coming to Rushmore for the purpose.
